

- Secured funding for new building campus in Hillsboro, Washington County using innovative funding from both Federal and State new market tax credits (NMTC). The development addresses the need for additional facility resources in this county and to improve on the quality of the facility resources.
- 2. Designed and completed an "Outcomes-based approach to training Head Start Staff" system of instruction addressing the needs of adult learners. Marketed this approach locally and nationally.
- 3. Acquired foundation funding to replicate a Child Care training model with joint participation between Head Start and the local Child Care Resource and Referral in Umatilla County.
- 4. Initiated and obtained first accreditation for OSHA Safety and Health Achievement Recognition Program 'SHARP' in center safety with plans to take this accreditation to all locations in OCDC.
- Initiated and instituted the first statewide contract between OCDC and the State Migrant Education Districts for joint service delivery.
- 6. Engaged in the agency's first Capital Campaign to support the Hillsboro building project in Washington County.
- 7. Met full enrollment for 2012!
- 8. Established the first urban inner city Native American Head Start classroom with NAYA in Multnomah County.
- Obtained two special Home Visiting grants- Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) directed at home visiting services in Malheur and Multnomah Counties to the general population.
- 10. Kaiser Permanente grant for wellness promotion in Washington County using parents as 'Promotoras'.
