

ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2009

- 1. OPK (Oregon Prekindergarten) expansion in Marion and Washington Counties and added two new counties, Klamath County and Jackson County as OPK providers; in total over 300 children added to service.
- 2. OCDC participated in the Governor appointed Advisory Council for the development of "Mental Health Wraparound Services" for Oregon's children.
- 3. In December 2009, received authorization and funding from the Office of Head Start for two years of Migrant and Seasonal Early Head Start services for 352 infants, toddlers, and pregnant women.
- 4. Sponsored an Emerson Hunger fellow who did a study on child care availability and impact of the repressed economy on child care.
- 5. Migrant Head Start expansion into new South Marion County/ Salem area for 90 children.
- 6. Instituted "Mutual Respect" policy as part of the OCDC 'Code of Conduct' derived from the OCDC Code of Ethics.
- 7. Established an OCDC Policy specific Union contract with employees in the counties of Washington, Multnomah, and North Marion.
- 8. Strengthened collaborations and partnerships with:
 - a. Disability service providers throughout the State
 - b. Dental provider networks via the Dental Home Initiative
 - c. The State WIC Program in participating and developing a data sharing agreement
- 9. Achieved full enrollment for OPK and Migrant and Seasonal Head Start.
- 10. Established an advanced degree program with Western University to facilitate teachers' completion of their degrees for Early Childhood Education.
- 11. Restructure of Executive Management by creating a Director of Operations instead of Head Start Director and creation of a Director of Program and Staff Development.
