

## OREGON CHILD DEVELOPMENT COALITION 2011 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- OCDC celebrated 40 years of Early Childhood education and care with sixteen County events across the State
- OCDC received sponsorships from US Bank, Beecher Carlson Insurance, Cherry Growers Inc. Health Net, and Modern Building Systems for the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gala Celebration
- OCDC received funds to expand Early Head Start in two counties through the Maternal, Infant and Early Childhood Home Visiting grant
- OCDC secured several key grants from :
  - Spirit Mountain Foundation to conduct an Early Literacy Research project
  - Kaiser Permanente to help prevent obesity and diabetes
  - Washington County Commission on Children and Families to support parent education
- OCDC established two major family literacy programs: "You Make the Difference" and "Opening Doors" with resounding parent participation
- OCDC continued to "grow" local garden projects in all centers and expanded the involvement of parents
- OCDC continued to promote enrollment in The Healthy Kids Program in seven rural counties
- OCDC is the only Migrant Program to host the Statewide Dental Home Initiative establishing a
  - cadre of 50+ dentists, collaborating partners with eight dental care organizations to address oral health needs of children with support from Head Start & AAPD
- OCDC participated in the Summer food service program and served a full meal (supper) instead of snack to children in the Short Term Migrant program for a total of 54,870 suppers served in summer 2011
