

OREGON CHILD DEVELOPMENT COALITION **2014 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- OCDC exceeded Funded Enrollment in all programs in 2014 serving more than 3100 1. children in Migrant and Seasonal Head Start and Early Head Start.
- 2. OCDC Foundation raised \$100,000 matching a challenge grant from Meyer Memorial Trust that completed the construction for the

Hillsboro facility in Washington County.

- 3. Over 25 parents received "Train the Trainer" instruction in the areas of Child Abuse Prevention and Safe Sleep.
- 4. 27 employees graduated from OCDC's Intern Program obtaining their Child Development Associate Credential (CDA).
- Expanded OPK Oregon Pre-Kindergarten by 79 5. children; 40 in Klamath County; 19 in Washington County; and 20 in Marion County.
- Expanded the Maternal Infant Early Childhood Home 6. Visiting (MIECHV) Program in Multnomah County and added Marion County as a new site. Home visiting services directed now in Malheur, Marion, and Multnomah Counties.
- Incorporated Food Security Identification into family assessment; concentrated 7. efforts to decrease food insecurity.
- 8. OCDC involvement in Oregon Early Childhood Hubs, at multiple community levels from governance to program services.
- Designated as the only Oregon "Safe Cribs" service provider by "Cribs for Kids". 9.
- 10. Successfully passed the USDA monitoring review.
- In 2014 the Auditor provided a clean opinion of the OCDC Financial Audit based on 11. review of financial statements resulting in no findings.
